



### workshop Level descriptions

BASIC SCD - for those who have had an introduction to Scottish Country Dancing, have a basic understanding of progressions, but need practice on basic steps and formations at a relaxed pace. Suitable for dancers with at least one month to one year's experience, or those who have been away from dancing for a long time and need a refresher.

INTERMEDIATE/ADVANCED SCD - for those with at least one or two years' experience who KNOW all the standard steps and formations, are comfortable with them and can generally maintain a good standard of technique (footwork, phrasing and handing) from exercises to actual dancing. This session will focus on new or less familiar material at a faster pace than the Basic workshop. Dances will be walked, but not necessarily from every position.


