



# WORKSDOP LEVEL DESCRIPTIONS - age 12 and over.

BASIC SCD - for those who have had an introduction to Scottish Country Dancing, have a basic understanding of progressions, but need practice on basic steps and formations at a relaxed pace. Suitable for dancers with at least one month experience, or those who have had interrupted instruction in basic footwork and formations.

INTERMEDIATE/ADVANCED SCD - for those with at least one or two years' experience who KNOW all the standard steps and formations, are comfortable with them and can generally maintain a good standard of technique (footwork, phrasing and handing) from exercises to actual dancing. This session will focus on new or less familiar material at a faster pace than the Basic workshop. Dances will be walked, but not necessarily from every position. 

### GUEST TEACHER: BILL ZOBEL



I started dancing in Kent, England, in the mid 1950's, and bought my first kilt with all my savings at age 14. I was interested in the music from very early on - drove my parents to distraction with three 78 records: Tim Wright, Jimmy Shand and Ian Powrie.

While a student at Newcastle University, I joined Newcastle Branch in 1962, where I was taught by Irene Fidler. I started teaching in 1963,

took teaching certificates in the early '70's and have taught all grades of classes since then including Men's Highland. I have been on St Andrews Summer School staff since 1988 and have taught workshops and schools in most areas of the world.

Muriel Johnstone and I formed Scotscores in 1988 to record music and publish books, (I have been having Scots elocution lessons ever since!!)

My most embarrassing moment in SCD – when the back seam of my trousers split open in the midst of a Sailors Hornpipe revealing parts of naval uniform not normally seen!! Most terrifying experience – MC'ing my first ceilidh at St Andrews Summer School. Highlights – MC'ing a ball

at Blair Castle with music played by Alasdair Fraser and Muriel and dancing a Sailor's Hornpipe for the Duke of Edinburgh. *My greatest enjoyment comes from:* 

- Easy elegant dancing to great music, especially strathspeys
- Making the dance fit the music, magic moments of the dance
- Introducing new dancers to joy on the dance floor
- Watching other dancers have their first 'magic moment'

Muriel writes: "I have been lucky enough to have had an extraordinary life in traditional Scottish music and dance. What started as a childhood hobby in Miss Ann Hughes' class in Saltcoats, Ayrshire, has taken me from Scotland to the USA, Canada, Australia, New Zealand, Japan, South Africa and across Europe! In 1988, with the help of Bill, the fledgling company "Scotscores" released its first recording - "Dancing Fingers". There are now 30 CDs on the Scotscores label and 20 books of music.

Composition is one of my favourite pastimes, but there are other loves in my life – family, golfing, cooking, reading and spending time with friends – never enough!"

### JUDI NICOLSON

Judi is originally from Banchory, Scotland, the heart of North-East fiddle tradition. In 1984, aged 15, she won the Golden Fiddle Championship.

She has appeared on television and radio and performed live as a solo artiste and also in groups and bands, including the Colin Dewar Scottish dance band. She has several solo and band recordings to her credit, and has published her own book of compositions. She lived in Shetland for 15 years before moving back to Aberdeenshire to teach violin in the schools. In Summer 2008 the family relocated to Katy, Texas where Judi has continued playing for Scottish Country dancers, in America, Canada, and Scotland. She played at TAC summer school in 2010, and will be playing at TAC in 2012 with Muriel Johnstone on piano. The duo will return to play for the Houston Ball, and also the Santa Fe Ball this year.
